The Rx&D International Report on Access to New Medicines 2008-2009.


Canada ranks 20th out of 25 OECD countries in public reimbursement based on a basket of 82 new drugs made available in Canada within the last five years.



# **Reimbursement – All Drugs**


Percent Public Positive Reimbursement of 82 Common Drugs, 2009

Select OECD Countries (n = 25)






# Access to New Medicines on Provincial Public Formularies (Launched Between December 1, 2007 and November 30, 2009)
